## Reports submitted prior to meeting:

Lake Wise - Tracey: final outcome of last summer's assessments - 12 properties were evaluated for Lake Wise awards and 8 passed. For next year, I am going to come up with a door hanger that can be left as the hardest part is getting in contact with owners. Once I am able to actually meet an owner, I have had only one person decline to be evaluated. The problem is finding people when they are actually at the lake! Kit & Rob's pilot project? Awarded Properties, neighborhood recruitment

July 7 Workshop - Tracey - For the Lake Wise seminar with Alison on Friday,

July 7, I am really hoping to enlist the property owners off of Twin Camp Road. My second idea is properties along Jones Rd. and I would love to get the Jenness/Fountain owners to agree but that is a real long shot. I will have something agreed upon in May to give us plenty of time to promote it

Lake Wise related BMP grants - Peggy - Will contact those from past years who are eligible for the grants, using the master Lake Wise files on Google Drive

SLA's newsletter articles - Trish and Tracey - wrote articles for fall newsletter; Neal - has begun planning with Sarah for spring newsletter

**Terrestrial Invasive species control** - <u>Gerry and Tracey</u> - cut & pulled twice, plants much less robust, Gerry found some at her place on the lake; <u>Peggy and Tracey</u> - Recruited neighboring Rossi and Fraleigh families who applied for Lake shore owners grants to fund control, contacted Weiselmanns - have not heard whether grants were awarded

Lake Watershed Action Plan (LWAP) - Peggy and Rhonda - Rhonda has communicated with Echo Lake Protective Association's President Steve Gratton who agreed to work collaboratively on a watershed Action Plan for the entire Echo watershed which includes Seymour's watershed. DEC has obtained funding for 3 LWAPs with Echo/Seymour being one of the three. Rhonda has learned that we will not need to apply for the LWAP, but will be informed when plans are final.
